



Iowa Code Sections 804.21 & 22 provide that the Chief Judge of a judicial district in this state and the Chief Judge of another judicial district in this state may enter an order permitting a person arrested with or without a warrant to be taken to a magistrate from any judicial district subject to the order. The City of Sheldahl Iowa occupies land in three counties: Boone, Story and Polk. Story County has or will be entering into an 28E agreement with the counties of Boone and Polk to provide law enforcement services for the entire city of Sheldahl. This 28E agreement, along with administrative orders signed by the Chief Judge of the second district and the Chief Judge of the fifth district, allows all persons arrested in the city of Sheldahl to be seen by a judicial officer in the second judicial district for their initial appearance. The effect of this order means that the counties of Boone and Story in the second judicial district and the county of Polk in the fifth judicial district, pursuant to 804.21 & 22, shall be considered as "approved judicial district(s)" for purposes of an initial appearance.


