Heddens moved, Olson seconded the approval of the Appointment of Stephane Spence and Nicole Fischer to ASSET, each for a term from 4/1/20-3/31/23. Roll call vote. (MCU)

REQUEST FOR THE STORY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' OPINION ABOUT A PROPOSAL TO CHANGE THE NAME OF SQUAW CREEK FLOWING THROUGH THE CITY OF AMES, STORY COUNTY (IN FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP), BOONE COUNTY, AND HAMILTON COUNTY - Murken reported on the request recommending of the name change; she forwarded the request to the other jurisdictions. David Gradwohl, Ames, reported on background information and recommended the new name of Hinage Creek. Wayne Clinton, Ames, provided additional history and stated support for a multi-jurisdictional review. He thanked the Board for its consideration of a long-overdue issue. This policy is very specific as to eligibility, and the Annual Story County Economic Development funding "grant" will be approved by the Board of Supervisors and certified each year to the Story County Auditor by December 1st.

TERM. The term of this Agreement, as priced above, commences on the In-Service date. In-Service date is defined as the date that billing begins. This period during the term commencing on the In-Service date and expires based on the contract term as identified above, shall be referred to as a "Contract Period." The Contract Period shall begin on the In-Service date. Thereafter be automatically renewed for successive terms of one (1) year each, subject to the right of either Party to terminate this Agreement by giving the other Party written notice of termination not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration date of the then current term.







Re: Changing the name of Squaw Creek

My name is David Mayer Gradwohl. I reside at 2212 Hamilton Drive in Ames, Iowa. I have lived in Ames for 57 years. I am a Professor Emeritus of Anthropology and American Indian Studies at Iowa State University. During my 32 years, prior to my retirement, I was faculty advisor to two American Indian student groups on campus: UNASA (the United Native American Student Association) and AIRO (the American Indian Rights Organization). In those roles, and other capacities over the years, I heard students complain about the derogatory term "Squaw" Creek. I supported attempts by students and faculty to get the name of the creek changed. All these attempts were unsuccessful.

So today, I want to thank those individuals who are calling again for a name change, and I thank the Board of Supervisors for taking this matter into consideration. In terms of the replacement of the term "Squaw" in other states for rivers, lakes, and a national wildlife refuge, it is an appropriate time for Story County to make this change.

I would like to suggest a name that would honor the Native Americans who occupied the State in which we live, and from whom the State of Iowa was named. Namely, the Ioway Indians.

To this end, I contacted Lance Foster, a former student of mine, who is an enrolled Ioway, one of few individuals who speak the Ioway language, is the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer for the Iowa Tribe of Kansas and Nebraska, and is also the Vice Chair of the tribe. Lance obtained two Masters degrees at Iowa State University: One in Anthropology, in which his thesis analyzed the significance of ritual objects in Ioway sacred bundles. The other in Landscape Architecture, in which his creative component analyzed the place names in the Ioway's sacred landscape.

Lance's response was: **"There is no Ioway name for it that I know of. One could call it Woman Creek instead, or Hinage.**

For the above reasons, I propose that Squaw Creek be renamed **HINAGE CREEK.**
