



RESOLUTION NO. 02-05

To fix a date for a public hearing on a loan agreement

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union Township (the "Township") has heretofore authorized and directed this Board to anticipate the collection of taxes levied on property within the Township pursuant to Section 359.43 of the Code of Iowa and to borrow money on its behalf in the amount of \$110,000 and to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and issue \$110,000 Township Fire Equipment Notes pursuant to Sections 359.45 and 331.402 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to fix a date of meeting of this Board at which it is proposed to take action to enter into the Loan Agreement and to give notice thereof as required by such law;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. This Board shall meet on the 14th day of August, 2001, at the Courthouse, Nevada, Iowa, at 9:30 o'clock a..m., at which time and place a hearing will be held and proceedings will be instituted and action taken to enter into the Loan Agreement.

Section 2. The County Auditor is hereby directed to give notice of the proposed action on the Loan Agreement setting forth the amount and purpose thereof, the time when and place where the said meeting will be held, by publication at least once and not less than four nor more than twenty days before the meeting, in a legal newspaper of general circulation in the County and of general circulation in the Township.

The notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE  
PROCEEDINGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT  
AND BORROW MONEY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT  
OF \$110,000

The Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, will meet on the 14th day of August, 2001, at the Courthouse, Nevada, Iowa, at 9:30 o'clock a. .m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and borrow money in the principal amount of \$110,000 for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of the acquisition of fire equipment by Union Township (the "Township").

The Loan Agreement will not constitute a general obligation of the County but will be payable by taxes levied on property located within the Township (excluding property within a benefitted fire district or within the corporate limits of a city) pursuant to Section 359.43 of the Code of Iowa, and the Loan Agreement is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Sections 359.45 and 331.402 of the Code of Iowa.



RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
RESOLUTION NO. 02-06—ADOPTING POLICIES AS A CONDITION OF APPROVAL FOR COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) APPROVED FUNDING**

WHEREAS, the Story County Board of Supervisors requested emergency financial funds from the Contingency Fund through the State of Iowa Community Development Block Grant Program in the amount of \$90,000.00 to eliminate the public health threat and aid in resident relocation of the residents of the Hillsdale Mobile Home Park. The amount requested for grant funding was based on estimates to provide financial assistance to the affected thirty-six (36) households, which includes over sixty (60) individuals of all age groups, as well as persons with disabilities.

WHEREAS, on June 8, 2001, the County was notified by the State of Iowa Department of Economic Development (IDED) that Story County was awarded funding through the Contingency Fund through the State of Iowa Community Development Block Grant Program in the amount of \$90,000 to provide financial relocation assistance to the residents of the Hillsdale Mobile Home Park.

**POLICY ON THE PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF EXCESSIVE FORCE**

WHEREAS, Story County, Iowa has received federal funding through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; and,

WHEREAS, Section 519 of the Department of Veteran Affairs and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act of 1990 requires that all CDBG recipients adopt and enforce a policy to prohibit the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within the recipient's jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and

WHEREAS, all recipients of CDBG funds are further required to follow a policy of enforcing applicable state and local laws against physically barring entrances or exits to a facility that is the subject of a nonviolent protest demonstration; and

WHEREAS, Story County endorses a policy prohibiting the use of excessive force and will inform all law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction of this policy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Story County hereby prohibits any law enforcement agency operating within its jurisdiction from using excessive force against any individuals engaged in nonviolent civil rights demonstrations. In addition, Story County agrees to enforce any applicable state or local laws against physically barring entrances or exits from a facility or location that is the subject of a non-violent protest demonstration. Story County further pledges enforcement of this policy within its jurisdiction and encourages any individual or group who feels that Story County has not complied with this policy to file a complaint.

Information and assistance relative to excessive force complaints shall be provided by the Story County Sheriff's Department, (515) 382-6566.

## APPENDIX B

### Story County, Iowa

#### The Residential Anti-displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan Under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, As Amended

Story County, Iowa will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income housing whenever the demolition or conversion is caused by an activity assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.496a(c)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years after the commencement of the demolition or conversion. Before entering into a contract committing Story County to provide funds for an activity that will directly result in demolition or conversion, Story County will make public by publication in a newspaper of general circulation and submit to IDED the following information in writing:

1. A description of the proposed assisted project;
2. The address, number of bedrooms, and location on a map of low/moderate-income housing that will be demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income housing as a result of an assisted project;
3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
4. To the extent known, the address, number of bedrooms and location on a map of the replacement housing that has been or will be provided.
5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of the replacement housing;
6. The basis for concluding that the replacement housing unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of initial occupancy.
7. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units (e.g., a 2-bedroom unit with two 1-bedroom units), or any proposed replacement of efficiency or single-room occupancy (SRO) units with units of a different size, is appropriate and consistent with the housing needs and priorities identified in the state's Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development.

To the extent that the specific location of the replacement housing and other data in items 4 through 7 are not available at the time of the general submission, Story County will identify the general location of such housing on a map and complete the disclosure and submission requirements as soon as the specific data are available.

The Story County Planning & Zoning Department (515-382-7245) is responsible for tracking the replacement of housing and ensuring that it is provided within the required period. The Story County Planning & Zoning Department (515-382-7245) is also responsible for ensuring requirements are met for notification and provision of relocation assistance, as described in CFR 570.496(a)(c)(2), to any lower-income person displaced by the demolition of any dwelling unit or the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling unit to another use in connection with an assisted activity.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, Story County will take the following steps, when appropriate and under the direction of the Story County Board of Supervisors, to minimize the direct and indirect displacement of persons from their homes.

1. Coordinate code enforcement with rehabilitation and housing Assistance programs.
2. Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent undue financial burden on established owners and tenants.
3. State rehabilitation of apartment units to allow tenants to remain in the building/complex during and after the rehabilitation, working with empty units first.
4. Arrange for facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily during rehabilitation.
5. Adopt policies to identify and mitigate displacement resulting from intensive public investment in neighborhood.
6. Adopt policies which provide reasonable protection for tenants faced with conversion to a condominium or cooperative.
7. Adopt tax assessment policies, such as deferred tax payment plans, to reduce impact of increasing property tax assessments on lower income owner-occupants or tenants in revitalizing areas.

Authorizing and approving a Loan Agreement and providing for the issuance of a \$110,000 Township Fire Equipment Note and the levy of taxes to pay the same

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Union Township (hereinafter referred to as the "Township") has heretofore authorized and requested this Board to anticipate the collection of taxes levied on property within the Township pursuant to Section 359.43 of the Code of Iowa and to borrow money on their behalf in the amount of \$110,000 to provide funds to pay the cost, to that extent, of acquiring certain fire equipment for the Township, and to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and issue \$110,000 Township Fire Equipment Note or Notes pursuant to Sections 359.45 and 331.402 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice duly published and hearing held thereon, the County has heretofore determined to contract such indebtedness and enter into the Loan Agreement; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary at this time to authorize and approve the Loan Agreement and to make provision for the issuance of a Township Fire Equipment Note in the principal amount of \$110,000 (the "Note") in evidence of the obligation of the County under the Loan Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby determines to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") with South Story Bank & Trust, Slater, Iowa, as lender (the "Lender"), in substantially the form as has been placed on file with the Board, providing for a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$110,000 for the purpose or purposes set forth in the preamble hereof.

The Chairperson and County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to sign the Loan Agreement on behalf of the County, and the Loan Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 2. The Note is hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$110,000, and shall be dated as of the date of its delivery to the Lender and shall be payable as to both principal and interest in the manner hereinafter specified.

The County Auditor is hereby designated as the registrar and paying agent for the Note and may be hereinafter referred to as the "Registrar" or the "Paying Agent".

Interest on the Note at the rate of 4.5% per annum shall be paid on each June 1 and December 1 to maturity, beginning June 1, 2002. Principal of the Note shall be paid in annual installments in the amount of \$11,000 each on June 1 in each of the years 2002 through and including 2011.

Interest shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year comprised of twelve 30-day months.

Payment of both principal of and interest on the Note shall be made to the registered owner appearing on the registration books of the County at the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the payment date and shall be paid by check or draft mailed to the registered owner at the address shown on such registration books; provided, however, that the final installment of principal and interest shall be payable only upon presentation and surrender of the Note to the Paying Agent.

The County reserves the right to prepay principal of the Note in whole or in part at any time prior to and in inverse order of maturity on terms of par and accrued interest. All principal so prepaid shall cease to bear interest on the prepayment date.

The Note shall be executed on behalf of the County with the official manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson and attested by the official manual or facsimile signature of the County Auditor and shall have the County's seal impressed or printed thereon and shall be a fully registered Note without interest coupons. In case any officer whose signature or the facsimile of whose signature appears on the Note shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Note, such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

**Story County Policy  
for Resurfacing/Reconstruction of Farm to Market Extensions  
Through Area Towns**

1) When a county project is being programmed for work through or up to the city limit of an incorporated town, the County Engineer will notify the town(through its Clerk) of the upcoming work to determine if they have any interest. If so, a 28E agreement between the Town and the County will be drafted, reviewed and executed by both parties. Plans drafted and let by the county will include the itemized estimated quantities of individual bid items that will be the town's financial responsibility. The reimbursement amount for the work done shall be based on actual quantities and the contract bid prices. All engineering and inspection for road work will be provided by Story County.

2) In a year when no county project is scheduled through or abutting that town's city limits and if a town wishes to use county assistance for their road project, the town shall notify the County Engineer of the work that they wish to accomplish. In order to be able to tie their project to the County's project(s)(if any are available), the town must provide a detailed set of plans certified by a licensed Civil Engineer with appropriate quantities. These shall be furnished to the County Engineer a minimum of 30 days before project check plans for the County's project(s) is due to the Department of Transportation Contracts Department. In addition, a 28E agreement between the Town and the County will be drafted, reviewed and executed by both parties.

Project quantities can then be added to the County's plans and let. A reimbursement amount for the work done shall be based on actual quantities used and the contract bid prices, plus an amount equal to five per cent (5%) of the total town work. All inspection of the road work will be provided by the Story County.

In both cases, a town will have the option (at the time of drawing up the 28E agreement) to divide the reimbursement into equal annual payments, not to exceed five (5) payments. If an extended payment option is used (paying less than the total due at the conclusion of the project), interest shall be payable at the rate stated in the 28E Agreement which has been determined by the Story County Board of Supervisors.

RESOLUTION 02-57

NOTICE TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS

Be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, that pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317, Code of Iowa 1990, it is hereby ordered:

1. That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands in Story County shall cut, burn or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined by this chapter, at such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from coming to maturity and keep such lands from such growth of any other weeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel.

Noxious weeds shall be controlled before the following dates and as often thereafter as is necessary to prevent seed production:

Group 1. By June 5, leafy spurge, wild mustard and musk thistle.

Group 2. By June 15, field bindweed, poison hemlock, horsenettle, velvet leaf, cocklebur, bull thistle, tall thistle and Canada thistle.

Group 3. By July 5, multiflora rose and annual sunflower.

2. Purple loosestrife can not be purchased or sold in Iowa.

3. That is the owners or persons in possession or control of any land in Story County fail to comply with the fore-going order, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this work to be done and the expense of said work shall be assessed against the land in the manner provided by the code.

"No Spray" signs are available at the County Engineer's Office.

The Story County Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management program will spot-spray and or mow serious Canada thistle infestations in county road rights-of-way and will treat other right-of-way vegetation problems as necessary to insure safe travel. Soil erosion by wind and water promotes annual and perennial weed growth on agricultural land and in road rights-of-way. Landowners are encouraged to utilize erosion control methods such as conservation tillage, field borders, buffer strips and grassed waterways.

A. Musk thistle is an increasing problem for pasture owners and is best controlled while in rosette during the spring or fall.

B. The Weed Commissioner recommends a second application of herbicide (as per label directions) to Canada thistle infestations after August 15, but before killing frost for more effective control of this perennial weed.
