STORY COUNTY CONSERVATION BOARD UTILITY PERMIT AMENDMENT

Date 3/19/24

To the Conservation Board, Story County, Iowa:

The Central Iowa Power Cooperative Company, incorporated under the laws of and authorized to do business within the State of Iowa, with its principal place of business at 14012 Hwy 13 SE, Cedar Rapids, IA 52403 does hereby make application requesting permission to occupy certain portions of public right-of-way or County owned property and that the Conservation Director be directed to establish the location of lines of transmission of electricity on parcel number in Section 19 of Township 82 N Range 23 W (hereinafter referred to as Property) for a distance of approximately 150 feet.

Agreements: The utility company, corporation, applicant, permittee, or licensee, (hereinafter referred to as the Permittee) agrees that the following stipulations shall govern under this permit.

1. The Permittee will file a plat setting out the location of proposed line on the Property and that the description of the proposed installation including type, size, and depth, of underground line.
2. The installation shall meet the requirements of county, state, and federal laws, franchise rules, and of the Iowa State Commerce Commission Regulations and Directives, Utilities Division, the Iowa State Department of Health, and any other laws or regulations applicable.
3. The Permittee shall be fully responsible for any future adjustments of its facilities within the Property caused by trail or trail amenity construction or maintenance operations.
4. Story County assumes no responsibility for damages to the Permittee's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said Property.
5. The Permittee shall take all reasonable precautions during the construction and maintenance of said installation to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the public and adjacent property owners.
6. The Permittee, and its contractors, shall carry on the construction or repair of the accommodated utility with serious regard to the safety of the public.
7. The Permittee shall be responsible for any damage resulting to said Property because of the construction operation, or maintenance of said utility, and shall restore property to its designed condition prior to Permittee's activity on the Property. This may include but is not limited to differential settling, surface cracking, erosion of slopes, vegetation growth, and other damage associated with this construction activity. Permittee shall reimburse Story County for any expenditure the County may have to make on said Property because of said permittee's utility having been constructed, operated, and maintained thereon. This obligation and all other requirements of this Permit shall be continuing in nature and extend beyond the term of this permit. The doctrine of equitable tolling extends the time within which an action for breach of this provision may be filed.

8. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless Story County Conservation Board and Story County, Iowa from any and all causes of action, suits at law or in equity, or losses, damages, claims, or demands, and from any and all liability and expense of whatsoever nature for, on account of or due to the acts or omissions of said Permittee's officers, members, agents, representatives, contractors, employees or assigns arising out of or in connection with its (or their) use or occupancy of the Property under this permit.

9. Noncompliance with any of the terms of permit, or agreement, may be considered cause for shut down of utility construction operations, or revocation of the permit.





This AMENDMENT No. 1 is by and among the County of Story, Iowa and **City of Collins** (collectively, “the Parties”). In consideration of the mutual covenants herein made, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT

1. Parties agree that an amendment should be made to the approved Grant Agreement:
  - a. Amend as follows:

SECTION 2.

**3. GRANT INFORMATION.**

(A) **Grant Amount.** The County agrees to make and the Subrecipient agrees to accept, on the terms and conditions stated in this Agreement, one Grant in the Amount specified on the Award Letter attached as Exhibit A hereto.

(B) **Project and Schedule**

a. **Grant Purpose.** The Grant is being made solely to finance the project described in the applicable Application. It is understood by Subrecipient that if funding is received to be added to an existing program, recipient must expend existing program funds prior to accessing SLFRF funds.

b. **Grant Expenditure Schedule.** The Grant will not pay any costs other than those incurred beginning after January 25, 2022. Story County must obligate all of the received SLFRF funds no later than December 31, 2024. Therefore, prior to June 30, 2024, Subrecipient shall submit a satisfactory plan that demonstrates the timely draw down of all awarded funds illustrating the Subrecipient’s ability to expend the funds by December 31, 2026. The Board of Supervisors may re-obligate funds awarded to the Subrecipient. Any re-obligations will be completed prior to December 31, 2024. The final date for expending the County’s SLFRF funds is December 31, 2024. If the project defined in this contract is not going to be able to utilize all funds, the Subrecipient agrees to notify the County in writing prior to June 30, 2024, so that funding may be reallocated. Therefore, all grant funds that remain unexpended as of June 30, 2024, must be returned to the County unless, by June 30, 2024, the Subrecipient submits a satisfactory plan to spend the funds by December 31, 2026.

AMENDMENT ALLOWED.

1. The Grant Agreement provides for this Amendment in Section 6 (D) as follows:

**Describe the project goals/objectives and how your proposal fulfills a public need that has been created or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. How will the project achieve these goals (what specific services will be provided)?**

Like most rural communities in Iowa, Collins is trying its best to manage its aging infrastructure. This includes its wastewater processing system and sewer lines. A number of years ago, Collins was required by the IDNR to upgrade these systems. So, we completely redesigned and built a new lagoon, as well as started the lining process of our sewer lines. Unfortunately, we've only been able to complete about half of the sewer lines. With this grant request, we intend to finish the lining project. Doing so will help ensure the people of Collins have a safe and sanitary wastewater system that is in full compliance with IDNR and EPA standards.

The need for this project was not created by the COVID-19 pandemic, but the financial hurdles in completing it HAVE been exacerbated by the virus. These kinds of projects are typically funded by raising taxes or adding fees to monthly water bills. Unfortunately, the current economic climate is creating a financial hardship for many of our constituents. Pushing a tax or fee increase at this time would put an unwelcome burden on the people we serve.

In addition, our plan is to go beyond the curb and provide direct relief to property owners. We know that homeowners are struggling right now. Between inflation, gas prices, and the cost of building materials (all due to the COVID-19 pandemic), it would be very difficult for homeowners to absorb the unplanned (and costly) repairs associated with unexpected repair needs. Our project will provide these owners not only with a televised inspection, but also affordable maintenance options if there is a need. This opportunity will help give owners a clearer picture of any potential threats to their system, as well as provide them with affordable steps to manage those threats before they become financially unmanageable.

**Describe how the success of your project/program will be evaluated and what is the desired community impact.**

The success of our project will be based upon contract fulfillment and established deadlines for completion.

The desired impact on the community is as follows:

- 1.) Provide community members a safe and sanitary wastewater system.
- 2.) Provide community relief by helping homeowners with an inspection program that will help them mitigate unexpected repairs and unnecessary financial burdens during this time of pandemic-induced economic instability.
- 3.) Provide the City important I&I data to help manage IDNR compliance, protecting the City from being mandated with larger, more expensive repairs and causing more financial burden on taxpayers.
- 4.) A final desired impact of this project is something that hasn't been explained in this request yet. Collins has a water loss issue that is way above the industry standard. Last month alone, we tracked a 48% water loss, and all efforts to this point have not allowed us to provide permanent relief. Water losses drive water rates, and those rates are at risk of going up even higher than they are. The lining work, as well as the residential inspection program will allow much needed televising... which we believe will help us locate water leaks that are undected because they are infiltrating our wastewater system. Detecting these leaks would be a huge benefit to Collins and could help reduce water bills for folks already struggling to meet their obligations.

We have gone to great lengths over the last decade to tackle projects that have made lasting and impactful changes to Story County. This project is an extension of those efforts. Also, ACCU-Jet is the only wastewater repair and maintenance program in the State of Iowa offering a community wide residential inspection program. 

Part ONE - Meals Program - This program hits several public needs. No other industry in our country has been harder hit than the hospitality industry. Restaurants fall in that category. Those businesses hit hardest are the locally owned businesses that do not have the support structure that comes with being part of a larger corporation. Estimates state that over 110,000 eating and drinking establishments closed in the U.S. last year, with nearly 2.5 million jobs being affected. Our concern is that the continued economic strain put on this industry will have an adverse and irreparable impact on Story County businesses. Places like Mi Casista (Nevada), Comfort Foods (Huxley), The Oil Press (Zearing), BFabulous BBQ (Stater), Sweat Oaks Bakery + Bistro (Collins), and Niland's Cafe (Colo) could become one of the aforementioned statistics unless we can provide the supports necessary to help them weather the storm of this pandemic. (The voids left by any such closures would be devastating to some of our County's rural economies.) Our goal is to help provide one of those supports by contracting these businesses to cater meals to our community.

A residual benefit of this program is that it will also provide direct relief to families in our area. Households will have an opportunity to order meals, at no cost, to help supplement their dietary needs, as well as provide respite from the rising cost of food.

Part TWO - Utilities Program - Our goal is to establish an emergency fund that will help provide direct relief to families who are struggling to pay their utility bills. Households who can demonstrate financial need will be allotted temporary assistance for up to 12 months of assistance in paying the minimum water bill amount (\$94).

**Describe how the success of your project/program will be evaluated and what is the desired community impact.**

Evaluation of these programs will be measured by participation. In terms of the meals program, the more participation the better. More people means more meals, which in turn means a greater stimulus to our local restaurants. In the end, though, the true measure of success will be the number of local restaurants that have maintained viability by the end of the current pandemic-driven economic crisis.

Measuring how this program impacts households may be a little harder to quantify. We will be taking surveys, though, to help evaluate and adjust the success of this program and the level of relief we are providing. The desired result of this program, of course, is to provide financial respite from the rising costs of food, to help minimize the stress that comes from having to feed a family, and provide the kind of socio-emotional support that will bolster those struggling in our community.

Participation will also help us evaluate the other portion of this funding request, which is the utilities program. Instead of more people, though, success will be measured by decreasing participation. The idea of this program is to provide direct, but temporary, relief to households that are suffering financial stress due to the economic fallout of the COVID-19 pandemic. Temporary relief such as this is designed to help people get back on their feet, catch a breath of fresh air, and help bolster their stamina to better move forward meeting their day to day needs. To help provide quantitative data, though, we will be requiring those participating to provide an entrance and exit survey from the program. Data will be used to help determine the full impact of this project on those households that are using it.

The Collins Mayor and the Collins City Clerk will be responsible for performing the work and achieving stated goals/objectives. Both the Mayor and Clerk have experience in managing grants, community based programs, meals contracting and distribution, and providing logistical support to organizations providing assistance within our community. A recently successful example can be found in our administration of CDBG grant funding that helped us establish our initial meals program. During said program, all deadlines, paperwork, and other requirements fully met CDBG guidelines and standards.

### **Has this proposal been approved by your Board of Directors/City Council/Applicable Entity? Please provide a date and form of approval (such as minutes or resolution).**

This proposal was approved at a special city council meeting, dated September 27, 2021. The approval of the city council has been documented in the city council meeting minutes and is now public record. A unanimous approval was given.

### **Are you working in partnership or collaboration with other entities? If yes, identify partners/collaborators. Indicate amount of financial support and in-kind contribution.**

We will be working with various restaurants around Story County to include: Mi Casista (Nevada), BFabulous BBQ (Slater), Comfort Foods (Huxley), Sweet Oaks Bakery + Bistro (Collins), Farmhouse Catering (Nevada), Riverside Camp (Story City), and potentially others. These businesses have worked with us in the past to come up with a discounted menu to provide to our community members. These discounts have provided an approximate 15% cost reduction to our efforts, which would equate to a total of about an \$8,000 in-kind contribution to the program's overall cost.

In addition, local church groups have volunteered to assist in the distribution and delivery of meals, which will help to offset thousands of dollars of potential costs associated with a program like this. Also, the City of Collins will provide administrative and logistical management to both the meals and utilities programs as part of our in-kind contribution.

### **Describe what would happen if you did not receive 100% of the requested funding from Story County.**

Since we have already successfully managed a program similar to the meals program (utilizing CDBG funding), Collins already has an established process in place to move forward immediately. Also, the meals program reaches to other communities and will have a more lasting impact on the long term viability of our County. So, we would prioritize this aspect of our request over the utilities program. In other words, if we are only partially funded for this request, we would use our resources toward the part of the program we know will have a direct impact on as many people as possible, the meals program.

Providing financial stimulus to our Story County businesses will help ensure their long term viability. Smaller towns are at risk, due to the economic fallout of the pandemic, of losing, in some cases, their ONLY source of hospitality. Supporting these businesses will help ensure the hard earned gains that these communities have attained in trying to revitalize their commercial districts. Investing in these businesses now will help guarantee their longevity for the future. Losing these businesses would have a long term and highly detrimental impact on Story County's rural population and the communities they support.

(A) **Grant Amount.** The County agrees to make and the Subrecipient agrees to accept, on the terms and conditions stated in this Agreement, one Grant in the Amount specified on the Award Letter attached as Exhibit A hereto.

(B) **Project and Schedule**

a. **Grant Purpose.** The Grant is being made solely to finance the project described in the applicable Application. It is understood by Subrecipient that if funding is received to be added to an existing program, recipient must expend existing program funds prior to accessing SLFRF funds.

b. **Grant Expenditure Schedule.** The Grant will not pay any costs other than those incurred beginning after January 25, 2022. Story County must obligate all of the received SLFRF funds no later than December 31, 2024. Therefore, prior to June 30, 2024, Subrecipient shall submit a satisfactory plan that demonstrates the timely draw down of all awarded funds illustrating the Subrecipient’s ability to expend the funds by December 31, 2026. The Board of Supervisors may re-obligate funds awarded to the Subrecipient. Any re-obligations will be completed prior to December 31, 2024. The final date for expending the County’s SLFRF funds is December 31, 2024. If the project defined in this contract is not going to be able to utilize all funds, the Subrecipient agrees to notify the County in writing prior to June 30, 2024, so that funding may be reallocated. Therefore, all grant funds that remain unexpended as of June 30, 2024, must be returned to the County unless, by June 30, 2024, the Subrecipient submits a satisfactory plan to spend the funds by December 31, 2026.

Collins Water Infrastructure Project

**Project/Program Purpose:**

The purpose of the project is to address the needs of our City's water infrastructure. Concerns with that infrastructure are based upon the following concerns:

Collins has a water loss rate of approximately 48%. (Industry standards allow an acceptable rate of loss to be between 10% and 20%.) Any such losses, unfortunately, are being passed on to the consumer... which in this case are the citizens of Collins.

Also, Collins has been operating for many years with undersized piping, providing limited water pressure and unable to accommodate residential expansion.

Finally, the City of Collins is working to support improvements being made to the athletic fields of the Collins-Maxwell CSD. Due to irrigation needs, our community softball park needs upgrades in the water lines that go to it. These improvements will allow us to also upgrade the entire nearby block, as well as place a new fire hydrant (for better emergency response).

**Describe the project goals/objectives and how your proposal fulfills a public need that has been created or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. How will the project achieve these goals (what specific services will be provided)?**

Goal #1: Make residential improvements to water infrastructure to the top 10% of our most concerning households as it relates to aging and leak-prone water lines.

Goal #2: Add a new firehydrant and 6 inch water line up to our local school's athletic complex. These improvements will also allow us to update some of the oldest (and undersized) water lines in town. This will help us locate and eliminate potential leaks and provide better service to community members.

Goal #3: Replace the water lines on 4th avenue from a 4 inch line to a 6 inch (and in some places a 12 inch line) to better serve citizens on the east side of our town. These improvements will also help us locate and fix potential leaks, as well as allow the City to support residential expansion toward the east of Collins.

The biggest benefit to this work is that it will help Collins provide repairs and upgrades to homes in areas that are designated as being a part of an LMI residential area. Many of these households have been hit hardest by the economic strain that the COVID-19 pandemic has ushered in. Additionally, the detection and elimination of water leaks could have a dramatic impact in lowering water bills and aiding households that are currently struggling with the cost of living increases that have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Describe how the success of your project/program will be evaluated and what is the desired community impact.**

This project's desired impact to the City of Collins is:

- 1.) The repairs significantly lower our town's water loss percentage.
- 2.) The repairs lower the cost of water and alleviate people's struggle to pay the current rates.
- 3.) Improvements adequately support the needs of the Collins-Maxwell CSD's athletic complex upgrades.
- 4.) Water pressure is improved for households in Collins.
- 5.) Collins is in a stronger position to support growth and expansion on the east side of our town.

In terms of measuring our success, we will closely evaluate whether or not the above objectives have been met, if all established deadlines have been met for project completion, and if we have been able to complete the work within our determined budget.

The Mayor, City Clerk, our Public Works Director, and City Council will all work together to ensure all achieved goals and objectives are met. Our team has a long and successful tradition of completing major infrastructure projects to include items such as building our new lagoon, the revitalization of our Main Street, grant administration, and stormwater improvements. Our PWD also has over 20 years experience in excavating, operating heavy equipment, and water line installation.

We will utilize the services of MSA Engineering, as well. MSA has a well established track record. MSA is also one of the engineering services that Story County uses.

Finally, we will only consider bids for work that are made by reputable companies that have experience and expertise in areas that pertain to this project.

### **Has this proposal been approved by your Board of Directors/City Council/Applicable Entity? Please provide a date and form of approval (such as minutes or resolution).**

Yes. The City Council of Collins approved this request at a Special Meeting on September 27, 2021.

### **Are you working in partnership or collaboration with other entities? If yes, identify partners/collaborators. Indicate amount of financial support and in-kind contribution.**

We will be working with the Collins-Maxwell CSD and MSA Engineering. Collins-Maxwell will be sharing a portion of one of the project components. The City of Collins will be providing in-kind contributions to this project through the use of our equipment, employee man hours, administrative capabilities, and other sources of labor needed to get the work done.

### **Describe what would happen if you did not receive 100% of the requested funding from Story County.**

Collins would delay portions of this project, based upon the amount of funding that we receive. Those delays will be dependent on the support of other funding (such as CDBG), and/or the dismissal of our current bond obligations through our TIF revenue... which is expected to be paid off within the next 2 years.

Considering that this project is compartmentalized, Collins will be able to make excellent use of whatever funds we are provided... and complete those components within any and all timelines established by the County. Logically, we will complete the smaller components first, then turn our attention to making improvements along 4th Ave for as many linear feet that our funding will allow for.

This project has a definitive beginning and end date, based upon receipt of funding and established deadlines for contract completion. There is no sustainability plan tied to this request.

MSA will begin their engineering services in January of 2022, with a completion date of March of 2022.

Permits to the IDNR will be requested upon completion of MSA's design and planning phase.

Based upon final cost projections and funding available, Collins will either begin improvements in house... or open the bidding window for interested contractors by April of 2022.

In house or contracted work will be completed for all phases by the summer of 2023.

**Describe how this project would make a significant, long-term difference in the quality of life for Story County residents.**

We are not only addressing utility costs for people in Collins, but we are also freeing up needed capital that could be used to support the local economy and other Story County businesses.

Our improvements are also designed to support growth and long-term viability of our community. These upgrades will allow us to promote residential expansion, provide more affordable housing within Story County, and potentially increase tax revenues.

Residential growth will likely attract a larger population, added businesses, and contribute to the long term viability of not just Collins, but SE Story County as well.

Finally, these upgrades will significantly enhance water service for the people in our community, as well as support improvements to the Collins-Maxwell CSD. These improvements will add fire hydrants, which can be better used by our town's emergency management services to help mitigate the risk of fire.

## MEMORANDUM

**RE:** Correcting a Scrivener's Error on the Approved Plat of Colton's Corner, a Residential Parcel Subdivision  
**MEETING:** March 26, 2024

### Introduction

On February 6, 2024, Planning and Development staff brought forward, under Resolution 24-52, an application for a Residential Parcel Subdivision to be known as Colton's Corner Subdivision. The Board of Supervisors approved and accepted the resolution for the subdivision at that meeting.

Upon trying to record the subdivision documents, the Recorder's Office brought it to staff's attention that the approved subdivision plat was mislabeled as a preliminary plat, rather than a final plat, and stated they could not record it. The mislabeling of the plat is a scrivener's error that does not impact the property owner's desire to subdivide, nor does it impact the configuration of the subdivision.

To correct the mislabeling of the plat, the surveyor provided staff with a corrected version for recording. Staff is now bringing forward a corrective resolution, 24-68, to nullify the previous approval of the erroneous plat.

Upon approval of Resolution 24-68, staff will record the resolution with the corrected plat and accompanying subdivision documents.

### Recommendation

The Story County Board of Supervisors approves Resolution 24-68, which has attached the corrected plat of Colton's Corner Subdivision.

WHEREAS, it appears that all conditions and requirements prescribed by Chapter 354 and Chapter 355, *Code of Iowa*, and as prescribed by the *Story County C2C Plan* and the *Code of Ordinances of Story County, Iowa*, have been complied with and met,

AND WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, that it is advisable and in the best interests of Story County, Iowa, and all persons concerned, that said Plat be re-approved, including with the original conditions noted below, and accepted.

*The subdivision not be recorded until one of the following occurs:*

- *An access easement meeting the requirements of Section 88.04 of the Land Development Regulations to use the current driveway access from US Highway 69 is shown on the plat to allow potential access to Lot 2; or*
- *Documentation of an executed access easement from another property allowing access to Lot 2 be submitted for review and approval. If the access is proposed to be from a new driveway from US Highway 69, the IDOT approval for such driveway shall be included. Any development associated with construction of access in the designated floodplain must meet all requirements of Chapter 80.*

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Residential Parcel Subdivision Plat of the Colton's Corner Subdivision involving real estate hereinafter described on Attachment A and shown on Attachment B being the same, is hereby approved and accepted, with the condition that the subdivision plat and accompanying documents shall not be recorded until the applicant provides documentation of an access easement to Lot 2, and all acts and deeds of the said owners and grantors in the premises are hereby confirmed and approved, subject to the aforementioned condition, and the real estate hereinafter described on Attachment A and shown on Attachment B shall hereinafter be known as Colton's Corner Subdivision.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair of the Board of Supervisors and the County Auditor are authorized and they are hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution 24-68 to be affixed to said Final Plat upon its approval by the Board of Supervisors.
