**Legislative Updates**

The Iowa 911 Communications Council and ISICS Board meet tomorrow.

Governor Reynolds signed SF659 into law which includes Division XII, language that allows the state 911 program to charge local 911 agencies for the delivery of 911 calls. This amounts to an estimated \$40,000 out of the Story County 911 Board budget invoiced from the state next year to cover their costs. The state is pushing an auto withdraw/withhold from quarterly wireless surcharge payments as an alternative to invoices. APCO/NENA largely recommends that PSAPs do not opt in.

APCO/NENA, in a coordinated effort with a coalition of public safety agencies, will meet to organize fall outreach to legislators and to develop a proposal for next legislative session. Upcoming meeting will be later this month. Legislative advocates under APCO/NENA are positive about the engagement thus far and the legislators that are already on board.

Under current provisions, any large project headed by the state could cause a money grab from local 911. We will continue to monitor and assess the condition of our budget, considering revenues, expenses, and subscriber fees. There is a potential that subscriber fee contributions to agencies would need to decrease at a sharper rate or be discontinued completely.
