

The Board of Supervisors met on 12/22/20 at 10:00 a.m. in the Story County Administration Building. Members present: Linda Murken, Lisa Heddens, and Lauris Olson, with Murken presiding. Linda Murken via zoom meeting. (all audio of meetings available at storycountyiowa.gov). Murken read the special note to the public: due to recommendations for social distancing in order to help slow the spread of the COVID-19 virus and limited space, the meeting will be provided via Zoom originating from the Story County Administration Building.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Heddens moved, Olson seconded adopting the agenda with noted change. Motion carried unanimously (MCU) on a roll call vote.

UPDATES ON COVID-19 – Heddens provided the most recent caseload statistics for the state and county.

COVID-19 VACCINATION PRIORITY GROUPS UPDATE – Les White, Story County Public Health, reported on vaccines received to date and the vaccination process. It is not known when more vaccine will be available. Discussion took place. Olson asked about accuracy of caseload statistics. White stated Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) stated all up to date for deaths and made consistent with State as primary diagnoses. Murken asked about inmates and homeless clients. White will report back.

STORY COUNTY FUNDING ALLOCATION TO THE ANALYSIS OF SOCIAL SERVICES EVALUATION TEAM (ASSET) PROCESS FOR FY22 – Sandra King, External Operations and County Services Director, reported on the process. Discussion took place. Murken stated the ASSET volunteers have a tough job this year. Heddens asked about mobile meals and food program; King reported. Andrew Allen, CEO of Youth and Shelter Services (YSS) reported on programs. Murken clarified the requested increase is 6%. King provided a letter. Olson moved 6% increase general basic and 6% increase local option, Heddens seconded. Discussion took place. Olson aye, Heddens nay, Murken nay. Motion failed. Heddens moved, Murken seconded the 5% increase for general basic and 5% increase local option. Roll call vote. (MCU) Discussion took place. Olson moved, Heddens seconded the approval of an additional \$1,100.00 in administrative services and a 4% in public health. Olson nay, Heddens nay, Murken nay. Motion failed. Olson moved, Heddens seconded the approval of an increase of \$215.00 for administrative services and an increase of \$400.00 for public health. Discussion took place. Roll call vote. (MCU)

DISPLAYING 24-HOUR YOUR LIFE IOWA CRISIS LINE/CENTRAL IOWA COMMUNITY SERVICES (CICS) MOBILE RESPONSE BANNERS AND YARD SIGNS ON COUNTY PROPERTY – Karla Webb, Community Services Director, reported on new marketing material. Yard signs are 24 inches by 18 inches, and the suggested banner size is eight feet by two feet. Webb stated she will work with Facilities Management to determine locations and manner for displaying the materials. Heddens moved, Olson seconded the approval of displaying 24-hour Your Life Iowa Crisis Line/CICS Mobile Response Banners and Yard Signs on County Property in coordination with Facilities Management. Roll call vote. (MCU)

DIRECTION REGARDING THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES (NACO) LIVE HEALTHY PROGRAM – Karla Webb, Community Services Director, reported on background information and distributed prescription discount cards to county offices and public spaces. She reported on program improvements and benefits. Webb requested direction from the Board regarding continued involvement with the NACo Live Healthy Program. Murken directed Webb and Erin Rewerts to continue with the NACo Live Healthy Program and to proceed with ordering program materials to make available to the public. Olson added media outreach.



Attached is an updated list of ASSET budget requests for FY22. The attached list replaces the one pulled from last week's agenda.

In previous years, the Board has decided to make increases or decreases to general basic, local option, public health, and administrative services in response to this request. Last December, the Board's decision included 5% increases each to general basic, local option, and public health; administrative services was increased by \$1,100 (to cover training and other costs in FY21).

As in previous years, the ASSET requests exceed what a 5% increase from the County would provide. Additionally, because of the time of year these requests are presented (mid-December), it is always just prior to the County going through its own budget process in January.

The Board's decision should include direction for the following: Increase/Decrease -

5 % - general basic

5 % - local option

400 % - public health

The yard signs are 24 inches X 18 inches, and the suggested banner size is 8 feet X 2 feet, however we can order the banner in a different size. Banners being displayed outside have reinforced corners, hems, and grommets.

To assist in educating the public regarding the availability of these services I would like to seek the Board's approval to display these materials at county buildings and properties and work with Facilities Management to determine the best locations and manner for displaying the materials.






