

The Board of Supervisors met on 8/30/22 at 10:00 a.m. in the Story County Administration Building. Linda Murken, and Lisa Heddens, with Murken presiding. Latifah Faisal via zoom. (all audio of meetings available at storycountyowa.gov).

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Murken added a personnel action form: new hire, effective 8/31/22, in Sheriff's Office for Kyle Hack @ \$1,927.80/bw. Heddens moved, Faisal seconded adopting the agenda with the addition. Motion carried unanimously (MCU) on a roll call vote.

PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING SEPTEMBER 2022 AS NATIONAL SUICIDE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH IN STORY COUNTY: The Board read the proclamation in full. Heddens moved, Faisal seconded the approval of the Proclamation for Recognizing September 2022 as national Suicide Awareness and Prevention Month in Story County. Roll call vote. (MCU)

RESOLUTION #23-13 AMENDMENT OF FY23 BUDGET: Lisa Markley, Assistant Auditor, reported on the amendment process. Murken opened the public hearing at 10:09 a.m., and, hearing none, she closed the public hearing at 10:09 a.m. Heddens moved, Faisal seconded the approval of Resolution #23-13, Amendment of FY23 Budget. Roll call vote. (MCU)

RESOLUTION #23-14, APPROPRIATION AMENDMENT: Lisa Markley, Assistant Auditor, reported on the appropriation process to spend authorized funding and asked for questions. Faisal moved, Heddens seconded the approval of Resolution #23-14, Appropriation Amendment. Roll call vote. (MCU)

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION POLICY FOR SAFETY AND ALERT PROTOCOLS FOR STORY COUNTY: Barb Steinback, Information Technology (IT) Director, reported on the need for a policy to establish specific guidance and protocols for emergency notification. Heddens asked about employee information. Steinback stated the handbook as well as the current guide also known as the red binder. Heddens moved, Faisal seconded the approval of the Emergency Notification Policy for Safety and Alert Protocols for Story County. Roll call vote. (MCU)

AGREEMENT WITH IOWA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (DOT) FOR INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEMPORARY DETOUR ROUTES: Darren Moon, Engineer, reported on the five-year plan, established emergency routes, truck load weight limits, and recommends approval. Faisal moved, Heddens seconded the approval of the Agreement with Iowa DOT for Incident Management Temporary Detour Routes. Roll call vote. (MCU)

DISCUSSION OF SPEED LIMIT REQUEST ON 680TH AVENUE IN SECTION 12, NEVADA TOWNSHIP: Darren Moon, Engineer, reported on a request for a speed limit sign. He recommends additional warning signs and curved road signs instead. A homeowner placed his own sign on the road and is pursuing drivers on the road. This issue needs to be resolved and the illegal sign removed. Moon reported on bridge, current standards, and two accidents in the last decade. His recommendation is to sign the curves with speed advisory warnings and notify homeowners. Discussion took place. Moon stated the owner-installed speed limit sign will be removed and will likely cause issues. Faisal asked how long it will take to add the recommended signage. Moon reported it will be quick if signs are in stock but otherwise will likely take time due to supply chain issues.

WHEREAS, September is known globally as “Suicide Awareness and Prevention Month”. The goal is to start the conversation about mental health and the impact of suicide to help destigmatize the conversation and help connect people with the appropriate support services; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (A.F.S.P.), Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death among adults, and the 2nd leading cause of death among individuals between the ages of 10 and 34 in the US; and

WHEREAS, more than 48,000 people died by suicide across the United States in each year, with an average of 132 suicides completed daily; and

WHEREAS, each and every suicide directly impacts a minimum of 100 additional people, including family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, and community members; and

WHEREAS, Story County publicly places its full support behind those who work in the fields of mental health, education, and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, our local mental health experts serve on the front lines of a war that many still refuse to discuss, as stigma regarding suicide and mental health issues is far too prevalent; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, We, the Story County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim September 2022 as National Suicide Awareness and Prevention Month in Story County and encourage all residents to take the time to understand the importance of mental health education and recognize that taking care of ourselves and others includes taking care of mental health.

Provider Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between Story County (Story County Sheriff's Office Jail Division), whose mailing address and telephone number is 900 Sixth Street, Nevada, Iowa 50201, telephone 515-382-7200, hereinafter referred to as "County", and Reta Lyon, hereinafter referred to as "Provider", whose mailing address and telephone number is 1116 K Ave Nevada, IA 50201, Telephone 515-290-9556.


1. **PURPOSE AND INTENT.** The purpose of the agreement is for the Provider to provide cosmetology hair care services to the inmate population of the Story County Jail.
2. **FEES, EXPENSES & COMPENSATION.** Provider may charge an individual per inmate haircut fee of \$25.00 for professional services necessary in the terms of this Agreement. Provider agrees that the individual per inmate haircut fee shall be totaled per visit and shall be the Provider's sole compensation for professional services and work performed per visit because of this Agreement. The Provider may ask to renegotiate the rate of the individual haircut fee, due to changes in current market rates, by giving 30 days written notice to the County. The Provider understands that the County reserves the right to request additional specific information in assessing the accuracy of claim information.
3. **INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.** It is understood that provider is an independent professional contractor and that Provider will not in any event be construed or hold itself out to be an employee or agent of the County. The Provider shall maintain all licensing and training required by the State of Iowa to provide professional cosmetology services. It is also understood that the provider will supply all equipment and supplies (with the exception of haircut chair provided by the County) needed to facilitate hair care services to the County (Story County Sheriff's office Jail Division). It is further agreed that at no time will the Provider or the work efforts of the Provider be under the supervision or control of the County, although Provider agrees to comply with all reasonable requests and regulations applicable to any other business invitee of the County. It is also agreed that Provider, as an independent contractor, is not restricted to working exclusively for the County during the term of the Agreement. The parties agree that this is a **non-exclusive agreement**, meaning the County may hire additional Providers to perform the same service if deemed necessary.
4. **INSURANCE & TAXES.** Provider is responsible for Workers Compensation, Disability, Unemployment, Automobile Insurance, and any other insurance required by the State of Iowa and will provide certificates of insurance to the County on an annual basis. Provider is also responsible for any payment of State and Federal taxes and any other applicable tax. Provider is not eligible for any benefits the County may provide for its employees.
5. **CONFIDENTIALITY.** Provider agrees to comply fully with confidentiality in compliance with all laws and regulations regarding protected health information.
6. **TERM AND TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT.** This agreement is effective on the 30th day of August, 2022 for a period of 1 year(s). The County may terminate this agreement

immediately upon Provider's refusal to, or inability to perform under the agreement or Provider's breach of this agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement for any reason, without cause, by giving written notice to the other party.

7. ACCESS TO BOOKS AND RECORDS. Unless otherwise required by applicable laws, Provider shall allow the County access to all books and records for the purpose of auditing or reviewing Provider's claims, upon request by the County. Provider's failure to provide access under this section shall constitute a material breach of the agreement.
8. REQUIREMENTS. Provider hereby agrees to perform all duties in accordance with all state and federal laws and regulations and jail facility rules. Provider assures that no person shall be on the grounds of race, color, national origin, or sex, as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under this program or activity. Failure to perform duties in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations and jail facility rules shall be considered a material breach of this agreement by the Provider.
9. EXTENSION. If mutually agreeable to County and Provider, this Agreement may be extended. Such extension will be documented by written amendment, duly signed and dated by both parties.
10. ASSIGNMENT. Neither party to this Agreement may assign, sell or transfer any part thereof to any other firm or entity without first obtaining the written permission of the other party hereto.
11. APPLICABLE STATE LAW AND WAIVER OF FEDERAL REMOVAL. This Agreement has been negotiated, executed and delivered in the State of Iowa. The parties hereto agree with all questions pertaining to the validity and interpretation of this agreement will be determined in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa in Story County, Iowa. The parties hereby waive removal of any issue hereunder to the federal courts.

This agreement and referenced attachments constitute the entire contract of the parties hereto and supersedes any prior agreement between the parties.



Emergency Notification Policy

Purpose

Story County is dedicated to providing a safe and secure environment for its employees and visitors. This policy is intended to provide Story County employees with specific guidance and instruction on how to initiate an emergency notification within County buildings. Those employees travelling outside the County buildings should have a method in place (within their department/office) to communicate emergency situations.

Policy Objectives

To promote guidance of safety alert protocols for employees and visitors.

Methods of Communication

- Desk Phone Page
- Overhead Speaker/Microphone Paging – Microphones are available in three locations HSC, Admin, Sheriff’s Office.
- Panic Button Alerts – Panic buttons are located in all offices, usually at the front counters. A panic (duress) alert cannot be withdrawn and law enforcement will respond.
- Story County Website – notifications will be posted in the alerts bar area on the main page, if time allows.

Policy

In the event of an emergency situation, a plain-language emergency script will be used to notify the proper individuals to initiate an appropriate response based on the Emergency Action Plan (Red Book) The emergency page may or may not include widespread notification based on the type of incident and established emergency procedures.

Procedures

- **What indicates an alert?**
Any situation that may be life threatening.
- **Who initiates the alert?**
Alerts should be made by the person or persons first identifying the need. Notifications should be made with whatever method of communication is most available to them.
- **What should the alert say?**
When initiating an emergency alert, the employee should keep it simple and direct. “Emergency in the building, please leave now”. Additional information such as “what” and “where” can be added if time allows.

After the alert has been resolved


If employees were evacuated, they should return to the building when the "all clear" has been sounded. The "all clear" should be made via the same method as first initiated, except when using the duress (panic) buttons. "All clear" repeated three times is the universal code for cancellation.

Testing

Emergency notification systems will be tested once per month. Employees should make themselves familiar with the different methods, locations, and situations for alerts. A copy of this policy will be placed in the Emergency Action Plan folder and at each of the three amplifier microphone locations.






