ASSET FUNDING

ACPC currently receives \$ in ASSET funds - \$ from Story County. Funding priorities for the county met by our services include:

- Safety and well-being of children and adults
- Move toward self-sufficiency for parents
- Prevention and referrals to early intervention services for the children.

We utilize ASSET funds to subsidize our sliding fee scale. Before this current school-year, our sliding fee scale was a single level reduction for all families, this year we introduced a tiered tuition system providing more assistance to families who need it the most, and also provide a reduction to a greater range of families.

During the last fiscal year ACPC served more than 400 children in our programs for children age 18 months to 12 years of age -- 32% of children enrolled in our preschool program and 68% in our school-age programming. 10% of school age families, and 28% of preschool age families utilize the sliding fee scale currently. Roughly 90% of our families reside within the Ames School District.

ACPC employs 27 full-time staff, and roughly 75 part-time staff during the school year. The majority of part-time staff are also students at Iowa State or DMACC.

We see our ability to serve the families of greater Story County as an advantage. Several of our families enjoy the fact that their child is close by while they are working in Ames. Additionally, our children as young as 18 months participate in field trips, and guest speakers from greater Story County.

Facility Improvements and Growth

In October of 2018 we wrapped up our HVAC retrofit project at our Main Center location. Originally anticipated to cost \$750k, the project finished out at just over a million dollars. While the project itself was quite an undertaking, we are happy to be able to provide a building with consistently comfortable air temperature and quality to our children, staff, and families.

Currently, work is underway on our next project, updating the fire alarm system. The system being replaced was original to the building. Work on this project should be complete in the next couple of months.

This year we were also able to increase capacity at our school-age sites, subsequently allowing us to provide before and after school programming to more children. As with last year, finding quality, reliable staff has been challenging and we are currently exploring alternate avenues to grow our staff to accommodate increasing enrollment.

Waiting Lists

Our programs continue to have very long waiting lists in many of our programs with the exceptions being two of our school-age sites. The largest need we see is in care for toddlers, three year-olds and at Fellows and Edwards. Currently there are more than 100 children who could enroll now off of the list if there were space and we receive on average 3 waitlist requests per day.



To the Board of Supervisors, Story County, Iowa:

The Alliant Energy IP&L Company, incorporated under the laws of Iowa, with its principal place of business at 1911 East Anson, Marshalltown, IA 50158, does hereby make application requesting permission to occupy certain portions of public right-of-way and that the County Engineer be directed to establish the location of lines of transmission of electrical on secondary route from Old Bloomington Road to Stagecoach Road, a distance of 1.4 miles.

Agreements: The utility company, corporation, applicant, permittee, or licensee, (hereinafter referred to as the permittee) agrees that the following stipulations shall govern under this permit.

1. The Permittee will file a plat setting out the location of proposed line on the secondary route and that the description of the proposed installation including type, height, and spacing of poles, maximum voltage, lengths of cross arms, minimum clearance and number of wires, type, size and capacity of underground cables, conduits, tile lines, and pipe lines, maximum working pressures for pipe lines carrying gas or flammable petroleum products are described as follows:

Installing new 1 Phase #1 AL UG along the west side of Stagecoach Road and the north side of Old Bloomington Road along with Junction boxes and pad mounted transformers. Burying techniques will include both directional drilling and trenching.

2. The installation shall meet the requirements of county, state, and federal laws, franchise rules, and of the Iowa State Commerce Commission Regulations and Directives, Utilities Division, the Iowa State Department of Health, and any other laws or regulations applicable.

3. The Permittee shall be fully responsible for any future adjustments of its facilities within the established highway right-of-way caused by highway construction or maintenance operations.

4. Story County assumes no responsibility for damages to the Permittee's property occasioned by any construction or maintenance operations on said highways.

5. The Permittee shall take all reasonable precautions during the construction and maintenance of said installation to protect and safeguard the lives and property of the traveling public and adjacent property owners.

6. The Permittee, and its contractors, shall carry on the construction or repair of the accommodated utility with serious regard to the safety of the public. Traffic protection shall be in accordance with Part VI of the current Iowa Department of Transportation Manual on Uniform Control Devices for Streets and Highways.

7. The Permittee shall be responsible for any damage resulting to said highways because of the construction operation, or maintenance of said utility, and shall reimburse Story County for any expenditure the County may have to make on said highways because of said permittee's utility having been constructed, operated, and maintained thereon.

8. The Permittee shall indemnify and save harmless Story County from any and all causes of action, suits at law or in equity, or losses, damages, claims, or demands, and from any and all

liability and expense of whatsoever nature for, on account of or due to the acts or omissions of said Permittee's officers, members, agents, representatives, contractors, employees or assigns arising out of or in connection with its (or their) use or occupancy of the public highway under this permit.

9. Noncompliance with any of the terms of permit, or agreement, may be considered cause for shut down of utility construction operations, or revocation of the permit.

10. The following special requirements, if applicable, shall apply to this permit:

Whenever the route of the proposed cable line runs along a paved secondary highway, the location of said cable shall be constructed on top of the road shoulder so as to be within approximately two-feet of the pavement edge.

Whenever the route of the proposed cable line runs along a dirt or gravel surfaced highway, the location of said cable shall be constructed on top of the road surface and as near possible to the shoulder line

Whenever a cross road culvert or bridge is encountered along the route of the proposed cable lines, said cable shall be constructed around the ends of said cross road culvert or bridge even though this looping is not designated on the situation plans attached hereto.

The crossing of the cable line from one side of the highway to the other shall be accomplished at a near right angle rather than diagonally so as to disturb the roadbed of the traveled way as little as possible.

Whenever the route of the proposed cable line is to cross a paved highway, such crossing shall be in a bored hole rather than open cut trench.




On Saturday, May 13, 2017 my office conducted deputy sheriff testing, which is the first step in obtaining a certified deputy sheriff hiring list from the Civil Service Commission. All applicants must pass a physical agility test and a written test in order to progress to the interview stage of the process.

The interview is conducted by a panel of four people within the sheriff's office. Each applicant interviewed is scored individually by each member of the panel. The scores are then compiled and the list is forwarded to the Civil Service Commission for certification. Our current deputy sheriff list was certified on July 28, 2017 and is valid for two years. On said list is Wayne Selle.

In the fall of 2018, over a year after testing for a deputy sheriff position and being placed on the certified deputy sheriff list, Mr. Selle became my son-in-law. At the end of March, the Sheriff's Office will have a deputy sheriff position open with the retirement of Capt. Barry Thomas. Iowa Code 71.1 states that an appointment of any person related by consanguinity or affinity within the third degree shall first be approved by the Board. Therefore, I am requesting the Board of Supervisors approval to give Mr. Selle a conditional offer of employment since he was on the certified deputy sheriff list prior to marrying my daughter.

After the conditional offer, Mr. Selle is still required to pass a physical, along with the psychological, hearing, and vision tests prior to a firm offer of employment.



Resolution expressing intent to enter into loan agreement and providing for the levy of taxes

WHEREAS, Sections 331.402 and 331.441 of the Code of Iowa authorize counties to enter into loan agreements and borrow money for the essential county purpose of constructing, reconstructing, improving or repairing county bridges, roads and culverts if such projects assist in economic development which creates jobs and wealth; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Story County, Iowa (the "County"), has proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$8,000,000, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 331.402 and 331.441 of the Code of Iowa, for the purpose of paying the costs, to that extent, of financing improvements to County bridges, roads and culverts, and has published a notice and held a hearing on that proposal; and

WHEREAS, in the Board's resolution adopted on February 19, 2019, setting the date for a hearing on the Loan Agreement, the Board determined that the following projects are in compliance with the requirements of Section 331.441 of the Code of Iowa that such projects will assist in economic development which creates jobs and wealth:

- 13th Street/220th Street paving extension from 580th Avenue to 600th Avenue
 - 530th Avenue paving extension from 260th Street to 280th Street
 - 560th Avenue paving extension from 315th Street south .92 miles
 - E18 asphalt overlay from Highway 69 to City of Roland
 - Timberland Drive paving for Story City subdivision one-half mile
 - 720th Avenue Bridge in Collins, Township 26
 - 248th Street pipe culvert in New Albany Township, Section 18
- and

WHEREAS, the Board has also determined to issue General Obligation Bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$8,000,000 (the "Bonds") in the future in evidence of the obligation of the County under that loan agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been advised that, because principal and interest will come due on the Bonds before June 30, 2020, it is necessary for the Board to make provision for the levy of a debt service property tax to be collected in the fiscal year that will begin July 1, 2019 for the payment of such principal and interest;


NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Story County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of providing for the levy and collection of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds, there is hereby ordered levied on all the taxable property in the County a direct annual tax for collection in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, sufficient to produce the amount of \$570,815.00.

Section 2. A certified copy of this resolution shall be filed with the County Auditor, and the County Auditor is hereby instructed to enter for collection and assess the tax hereby authorized. When entering such taxes for collection, the County Auditor shall include the same as a part of the tax levy for Debt Service Fund purposes of the County and when collected, the proceeds of the taxes shall be converted into the Debt Service Fund of the County and set aside therein as a special account to be used solely and only for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds.







**Jurisdiction Agreement for Designated Iowa Byways™
Byway Management, Off-Premise Sign Management and
Signage Installation and Maintenance**

The Iowa Scenic Byways Program was established under Iowa Code Chapter 306D and provides for state and local development and Department designation of Iowa Byways. The Iowa Byways program was established to identify, protect and enhance roadways in Iowa which exemplify the state's scenic and historic resources. This effort is carried out through volunteer work and cooperation between interested citizens, organizations, local governments, and the Department.

The following provides the terms of agreement between the Iowa Department of Transportation (herein known as the Department) and Story County (herein known as the Jurisdiction) for the installation and maintenance of byway signage on the Jefferson Highway Heritage Byway. Signature by authorized parties establishes acceptance of these terms.

Iowa Byways™ Designation

1. Applications to designate Jefferson Highway Heritage Byway as an Iowa scenic byway were submitted with the official endorsement of the Jurisdiction; and the Department has designated the Jefferson Highway Heritage Byway on the route proposed.
2. Upon designation as a state scenic byway, local sponsors are responsible for funding tourism and promotional plans and activities and no federal or state funding is inherent these designations.
3. The Department will enforce certain restrictions of off-premise signs along portions of the byway which follow interstate or primary highways in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 761 - 117.3(1); and the Jurisdiction will be responsible for signing ordinances and compliance for roadways under their jurisdiction.

Iowa Byways™ Signage


1. Signs, posts and hardware for marking the route for the above referenced Iowa Byway shall be furnished and installed by the Department for the life of the designated byway.
2. The installations shall comply with the Department's Traffic and Safety Manual Chapter 02G Iowa Byways Signage Policy.
3. Initial installation of signs shall be coordinated between the Iowa Byways Program, the local Department maintenance staff and the Jurisdiction. This may include a shared review of the signing plan if needed, coordination of materials, location and installation, particularly in cities.
4. The Department is responsible for installing and maintaining referenced signage for the life of the designated byway in accordance with the signage plan for the Jefferson Highway Heritage Byway.
5. Missing or damaged sign panels shall be ordered from the Department through the Iowa Byways Program at no cost on an as needed basis. Replacement signage and materials shall be delivered to the closest Department maintenance facility.
6. The local byway managing entity and/or the Department shall conduct periodic inventories to further assure proper placement and condition of the byway signage.
7. Intentionally damaging signage or unauthorized removal is considered a federal offense and is punishable by federal law. The Jurisdiction shall do everything in its power to apprehend and prosecute offenders who damage or remove signage from its installed location.






AGREEMENT FOR GRADING AND PAVING OF 560th AVE. (E63 SOUTH 0.91 MILES)

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT made pursuant to Iowa Code section 28E.12 by and between City and County upon the following terms and conditions:

1. DEFINITIONS. When used in this agreement, unless otherwise required by the context:
 - a. "CITY" means the City of Huxley, Iowa, a municipal corporation located in the county of Story, state of Iowa.
 - b. "COUNTY" means Story County, Iowa, a municipal subdivision of the state of Iowa.
 - c. "PROJECT" means the grading, drainage structures, and paving of 560th Ave. from E63 south 0.91 miles.
 - d. "PLANS" means the construction drawings and specifications to be prepared by or for CITY and approved by CITY and COUNTY.
 - e. "ADMINISTRATOR" means the Public Works Director and/or the City Engineer of Huxley.
 - f. "AGREEMENT" means this instrument in its entirety and the PLANS which shall constitute an integral part hereof.

2. DURATION. This agreement shall take effect from the date of its execution by both CITY and COUNTY and shall thereafter continue in full force and effect for such time as shall be necessary to fully accomplish its stated purposes and until it is terminated in accordance with its terms.

3. NO SEPARATE ENTITY. The agreement does not create a separate legal or administrative entity.

4. PURPOSE. The purpose of the agreement is to provide for the joint and cooperative design, construction and contract administration of the PROJECT in Story County inside and outside of the City's corporate limits.

5. CONSTRUCTION BIDS. After the PLANS have been approved by CITY and COUNTY, CITY shall let the PROJECT. Thereafter, and prior to the awarding of any contract for construction of the PROJECT, CITY shall submit to COUNTY for review copies of all bids received along with CITY'S recommendations concerning the award of contracts for construction of the PROJECT.

6. AWARD OF CONTRACTS. After COUNTY has approved CITY'S recommendations concerning the award of contracts for the construction of the PROJECT, CITY may enter into contracts for the construction of the PROJECT. COUNTY will not be a party to the construction contract or the engineering consultant contracts. The County shall review all consultant contracts before CITY approval.

7. SUPERVISION OF CONSTRUCTION. The ADMINISTRATOR shall have general supervisory authority over the PROJECT. COUNTY'S engineer may inspect the PROJECT from time to time at his discretion for purposes of verifying compliance with this agreement.

8. ACCEPTANCE OF CONSTRUCTION. After construction of the PROJECT has been completed in an acceptable manner and so certified by the ADMINISTRATOR and approved by COUNTY, CITY shall formally accept the work performed under the construction contracts.

9. PAYMENT OF PROJECT COSTS. All costs of the PROJECT will be shared equally by CITY and COUNTY, but the maximum total amount that the COUNTY will reimburse to the CITY is \$1,000,000 for this PROJECT. The CITY will bill the COUNTY its portion of reimbursable cost once a month and payment will be made within 30 days of receipt. All invoices to COUNTY must include detailed documentation of reimbursable costs. Within 90 days after CITY'S formal acceptance of the completed PROJECT the CITY shall bill to the COUNTY all remaining reimbursable cost, and final payment will be made to the Contractor. Reimbursable costs shall include costs for engineering, preparation of construction drawings and specifications, construction costs and costs for construction administration and inspections. Each party shall be responsible for the costs of acquiring the required right-of-way for the PROJECT that falls within their jurisdiction as it exists on the date of this agreement.

10. TIMETABLE. COUNTY and CITY shall each proceed with reasonable diligence in the performance of all actions required by them, respectively, under this agreement.

11. TERMINATION. Upon completion of the PROJECT and performance of all actions required by COUNTY and CITY by this agreement, as acknowledged by resolution adopted, respectively, by the Board of Supervisors of COUNTY and the Council of CITY, this agreement shall terminate. Upon completion of the PROJECT the CITY shall accept jurisdiction and control of this segment of roadway.



CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PLAN

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Introduction

The Story County Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) is a multi-year guide to the construction and/or improvement of county facilities and the acquisition of equipment. Through the process of preparing and updating this CIP, the County meets the need for orderly maintenance of the County's physical assets. This CIP is intended to serve as a planning tool and is structured to present meaningful long-range perspective of the County's long-range capital needs and to be used as an implementation tool for the acquisition, development, construction, maintenance, and renovation of public facilities, infrastructure, and capital equipment.

The Story County Board of Supervisors first identified the development of this Plan in the May 2013 Strategic Plan adopted by the Board and have adopted a CIP each following year . The CIP runs on a fiscal year basis – July 1st through June 30th, and defines projects on a five year timeframe.

The CIP adopts the 5-Year Story County Secondary Road Construction Program, updated and adopted annually, by reference.

The following project timeframes are identified in this current CIP:

Current Projects	Those in the current FY cycle (FY19)
Year 1	FY 20: July 2019 – June 2020
Year 2	FY 21: July 2020 – June 2021
Year 3	FY 22: July 2021 – June 2022
Year 4	FY 23: July 2022 – June 2023
Year 5	FY 24: July 2023 – June 2024



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Process to Develop CIP

It is anticipated that the CIP is reviewed annually and is updated as necessary. Preparation of the CIP is an interactive process that takes approximately four to six months each cycle. The CIP is developed in a manner consistent with approved County financial policies that set guidelines for the CIP and for the funding of maintenance and replacement projects.

Elected Officials and Department Heads were asked to submit proposed projects in December 2018 in line with the initial budget preparations. County staff members reviewed proposed projects and identified those to recommend to the Board of Supervisors to include in the CIP. As budgets were prepared and submitted, additional projects were included as identified through the Board of Supervisors' worksessions in January 2019.

The projects are categorized beginning on page seven by year as noted above. The CIP is not meant to be a static document - it is intended to help the Board of Supervisors in their budgeting discussions and prioritization. As a guiding document, it may be amended as warranted.



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Terms and Definitions

Story County has defined key terms in order to help guide the development of this CIP.

Capital Assets

Capital assets include land, facilities, parks, playgrounds and outdoor structures, special projects from Secondary Roads, pedestrian and bicycle systems, water and sewer infrastructure, technology systems and equipment, and other items of value from which the County derives benefit for a significant number of years.

Capital Projects

Capital projects result in economic activities that lead to the acquisition, construction, or extension of the useful life of capital assets. They have a total project cost in the range of \$25,000 or more; range from construction of new buildings to renovations, additions, conversions, or demolitions of existing buildings; have a useful life of five years or longer, significantly extend the useful life of an asset, or significantly alter the nature and character of an asset (not to include annual asset maintenance costs, annual warranty costs or other ongoing costs.)

The CIP includes four different types of projects: equipment, new project/construction (and project continuation to following years), modification of existing project, and maintenance.

- ◆ **Equipment**

The proposed purchases/lease/rental of equipment, including vehicles, software, hardware, and other applications when the costs exceed \$75,000.

Projects such as new building(s), land acquisition, remodels, and related items costing over \$25,000 are included and identified in one the following three categories:

- ◆ **New Project/Construction**
- ◆ **Modification of Existing Project (includes project extension)**
- ◆ **Building Maintenance**

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Projects are listed in order of potential fiscal year in which the project may be undertaken. However, as this is a dynamic document, project schedules may change and be moved up or down on the timeframe, due to many factors, such as budget, staffing, and priorities. Also, estimated amounts and potential funding sources are meant only as guidance in this document. Elected Officials, Department Heads, and the Board of Supervisors identify the projects and funding mechanisms in the annual budget process.

Develop Capital Improvements Program

Benefits: Better schedule public improvements that require more than one year to construct. Provide an opportunity for long-range financial planning and management.

The adopted CIP runs on a fiscal year basis – July 1st through June 30th, and defines projects on a five year timeframe. It will be reviewed annually and updated as necessary.
