**1. CALL TO ORDER**

Dr. John Paschen called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

Contract between Iowa Department of Public Health and Story County Board of Health For Intervention Implementation In Target populations.

**ADDITIONAL ITEMS:**

**1. Indoor Tanning Bed Ordinance**

Margaret Jaynes stated that the state is no longer offering a contract to do tanning inspections and at a previous meeting, the board directed staff to provide ideas for a tanning ordinance. Jaynes presented examples of ordinances from Minnesota and Utah. Jaynes stated that it is not known if the state will still be handing tanning licenses. Jaynes stated that staff would like to keep things the same, with the addition of a parent/guardian consent requirement for those tanning under the age of 18, and asked the board for direction on the addition of a parental consent being added. Jaynes stated that the ordinance could be drafted and brought back to a future meeting-adopting wording from the Iowa Code with the addition of a parental consent requirement. Paschen asked for clarification about the state collecting the licensing



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fee, but the county doing the inspections. Jaynes stated that in the past the state maintained a list of licensed tanning facilities, collected the fee and then let the county know who is licensed. The county did the inspections, collected the inspection fees and enforced regulations.

**Motion by Kluge, Second by Speck to draft a tanning ordinance with the addition of parent/guardian consent for tanning under the age of 18. MCU**

Heddens stated that the proposal does not align with what is currently in the Iowa Code so it could be challenged. Jaynes stated that in the past if the state does not want more stringent requirements it is written that home rule is taken away. Jaynes stated that she would forward a copy of the proposed ordinance to the state.

**6. AGENCY AND DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS**

**a. Story County Public Health**

Les White and Teresa Ferrari spoke and provided an update on the community needs assessment, which is due in 2020. White summarized the steps in the process that will be completed over the next year. White spoke about the Intervention Implementation grant which awarded \$8,000 to be used for diabetes programs. Teresa Ferrari stated flu shot clinics have started and school audits will begin soon. Heddens asked if public health uses social media. Ferrari stated that public health does not use social media and information would be accessible through Mary Greeley's website. White stated that discussions have taken place with Community Relations on how to better inform the public about programs. Kluge asked if children of Story County are only served in vaccination clinics and Ferrari stated that people from other counties are welcome to attend.

**b. YSS**

Denise Denton provided an update on school programs and provided clarification about what information is being provided to schools after the budget cuts. Contact was made with Community and Family Services to try to prevent providing the same information to schools. Denton provided information about vaping and stated that there are now five states who have banned vaping. Paschen provided information about medical cannabis and stated it is hard to get a license to study a schedule 1 drug. Heddens asked for clarification about bans for vaping in public. Denton stated that vaping is already banned in all public spaces in Story County like what there is with tobacco.

**c. Story County Environmental Health**

Margaret Jaynes provided an update on well permits, well plugging, well rehabs, cisterns, and water samples. Grants to Counties for FY2020 awarded was \$31,000. Jaynes provided an update on Tullamore Glen water supply, which recently had several positive samples for coliform bacteria. Residents are considering reverse osmosis ultraviolet treatment, well construction or rural water. Jaynes provided information about well records from Rewerts Well Company that they shared and the information has been scanned into our system. Jaynes updated the total number of septic permits issued for calendar year 2019 is 63 completed and 79 inspections. Comfort Inn and Mortensen Heights new pool inspections have been completed. Complaints received were for open burning of cleared trees, mold in a Gilbert apartment, dumping concrete in storm drain, chicken manure stockpiled, and bats in an Ames apartment. Conceptual Reviews were completed for Gryte Minor Subdivision, Snell Minor Subdivision, Friend Variance and Story County Animal Control Tower. Jaynes updated trainings and meetings completed by staff. Jaynes provided information about the possibility of changing data management from the current PIP system to a new software system within the next five years. During a recent meeting with the IT Department it was reported that they do not support any department made software and prefers software be purchased. Jaynes stated that with budget reviews



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coming up this item would be discussed further. Other issues are that if continue using PIP it will not integrate with GIS because ESRI is phasing out and switching to ARC Pro within the next 5 years and will not work with Microsoft Access which is where all of the data is currently stored. Jaynes provided information on miscellaneous items, which included septic installation complaint, overdue binding agreements, COOPCOG document review, ISU poultry septic systems, Peterson mound TOT issue, replaced soil probe parts, mound trouble shooting, Hickory Grove lagoon issue, and EOC. Jaynes provided an update on the Draft Septic Ordinance and stated that proposed changes are still being worked on. Jaynes stated that there would be a stakeholders meeting and hoping for input on proposed changes. Jaynes stated that septic information is now available on Beacon and that the baseline water quality testing has been started.


